

Graduate Feng Shui Practitioner's Course in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia

Day 1 - Lecture, Regent Hotel Audit, Shopping Mall Audit

The course began with a refresh of the basics of measurements using the Luo Pan, the Chinese compass, for doors, roads and other structures. Every student was required to give a basic audit of the Regent Hotel, a large commercial property. Impressive was the architectural setup of the outside of the hotel as the hotel threw out negative Qi to surrounding buildings due to many and very sharp edges at the facade.



Next was a quick tour of the shopping malls around the hotel. During the tour, students were given background information of the malls history, success or failure of each mall. We were then invited to give our opinions on the current success or failure situation of the malls. The use of the Luo Pan was minimized at the malls as Feng Shui is more than just about directions; it's also about the exterior landform, Luan Tou, shapes of buildings, and on the inside of the buildings the selected designs, stairs and interior decorations.
