

## Graduate Feng Shui Practitioner's Course in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia

### Day 4 - Graveyard Nirvana Memorial Park

This day was dedicated to Yin Feng Shui – Feng Shui for graveyards. This is an important aspect of Feng Shui as the modern Yang style of Feng Shui for residences actually originated from the Yin style of Feng Shui. The knowledge that we currently have of Yin Feng Shui is credited to Master Guo Pu, who wrote the "Book of Burying the Dead" during the Jin Dynasty.



For this exercise, a tour to the graveyard Nirvana Memorial Park in Semenyih was arranged. Once there, we had the opportunity to check out the mountain embrace and how it was used to select a proper burial site. In this instance, the direction of the tombstone is the most important aspect in relation to land forms regardless of the Ming Gua of the deceased.



Many unique tombs were investigated, including a singing tomb of a singer from the 1950. Pressing a button at the tomb her favourite song was played. The students were also pointed out the direction of the water flow and the water outlet of every burial site - very important aspects of Feng Shui which were covered in the Advanced Course.



Impressive was the huge dragon burial site, in which many urns were placed. However, a cremation and urn burial is not in accordance to Feng Shui principles.
